Camp Counselors are the heart of Camp Trotter! You'll live with and supervise a cabin group of campers, lead activities, and create a positive, memorable camp experience. We're looking for energetic, responsible individuals who love working with youth and want to be part of building a brand-new camp program from the ground up.

Key Responsibilities:

- Supervise and mentor a cabin group of campers 24/7
- Lead and assist with camp activities including:

 - STEM activities (science, technology, engineering, math)
 - Archery

 - Sports (capture the flag, kickball, baseball, basketball, 4 square)
 - Team building and orienteering
 - Tie-dye and rocket building

- Ensure camper safety, wellbeing, and positive behavior
